


Description








Fig.1 Output Characteristics




Fig.2 Typical Transfer Characteristic




Fig.3 Typical On-Resistance vs Drain Current and Temperature




Fig.4 On-Resistance Variation with Temperature




Fig.5 Diode Forward Voltage vs. Current




Fig.6 Maximum Drain Current vs. Case Temperature




Fig.7 Gate Charge Characteristics




Fig.8 Typical Junction Capacitance




Fig.9 Safe Operation Area







Fig.10 Transient Thermal Resistance
